ABSTRACT

The present research examines Adorno's notion of expression and its relation to arts and music in *Aesthetic Theory*. It investigates his dialectics between subject and object in relation to his critique of reason and natural beauty fundamental for Adorno's comprehension of expression as suffering that influences his notion of the musical material revealing the importance of music for the individual and society.
