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Three Major Vengeful Spirits in Japan



Taira no Masakado

- **75th Emperor Sutoku** 崇徳天皇 (1119-1164)
Lost the political battle and exiled to Shikoku
- **Taira no Masakado** 平將門 (903-940)
killed after declaring independence from Japan as the 'new emperor'
- **Sugawara no Michizane** 菅原道真 (845-903)
demoted to Kyushu due to slander



- 400th anniversary year - Eiroku Incident


<Early Modern>

- 500th anniversary year - Great Fire of Meireki
- 600th anniversary year - Hōreki Incident
- 700th anniversary year - Kinmon Incident

What is the Definition of *kami* 神 in Shinto?

“*Kami* are the deities in heaven and earth in mythology, or spirits enshrined in Shinto shrines. Not to mention human beings, birds, animals, plants, oceans, mountains, and whatever else is uncommonly great and rare are called *kami*. The meaning of great is not necessarily limited to what is precious, excellent, good or meritorious. **Even the wicked and the suspicious are *kami*, if they are powerful or rare.**”

→ Devil and Satan also can be *kami* if they are great.



Establishment of Shiramine Grand Shrine



Shiramine Grand Shrine in Kyoto
白峯神宮

- Established 1868
- Enshrines 75th Emperor Sutoku and 47th Emperor Jun'nin
- Praying will bring people successful for sports
- Emperor Meiji dispatched an imperial envoy to Emperor Sutoku's Imperial mausoleum to announce the establishment of the shrine **on the day before his enthronement** (the anniversary of Emperor Sutoku's death).
